If You Do Not Grow Weary

Galatians 6:6-18

God wants to prevent disasters in the world, and of course, He wants to prevent disasters for you. God stopped Israel's disasters at least seven times, and each time he called on God's covenantal people. These are the 7 Remnants. Joseph was sold into slavery in Egypt, but that slavery blocked the disasters of that nation. Moses led the enslaved people out of slavery 400 years later with covenantal blood. Many things happened in the wilderness, but he didn't waver and the word God gave him was fulfilled. This is a time of disaster of spiritual problems. There are all kinds of spiritual problems, mental problems, and addictions that are on the rise. Joseph, who was sold into slavery, had something special that no one else had, and that was a Word from God. With this Word that no one else knew, he saved a nation and an age. He knew the covenant and was given a mission and a dream of revelation. It seems like nothing in the eyes of men; his brothers wanted to kill him because of it. Has God called you in His plan? It's something to ponder.

1. If you do not grow weary

- 1) Galatians 6:9 "And let us not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." There are many good things in the world. It's all good, but to be truly good, it has to be good in the eyes of God.
- 2) The greatest good in the world is salvation. There is no greater good than to save a person from a curse. So when one does good, one can take it to mean to receive salvation.
- 3) Genesis 4:7 "If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is contrary to you, but you must rule over it." In Genesis, God is speaking to Cain and says that sin will be crouching at the door of your house if you do not do good. This sin is referring to Satan, so the good here is referring to the covenant, the blood of Christ.
- 4) So in the end, then, to do good is to fulfill the covenant, and therein lies the salvation of God. If you do not grow weary and do not give up, you will reap in its season. This is not to say that other fleshly good works are excluded, of course.
- 5) Don't grow weary or discouraged, don't give up, hold on to your covenant, and pray. Galatians 6:7 "Do not be deceived: God is not mocked, for whatever one sows, that will he also reap." It's saying that if you continue to do your best to sow the covenant, even when you fall short and are weak, you will reap what God has promised in the covenant.
- 6) For you are weak and often sow the things of the flesh, but if you continue to sow the covenant regardless, you will reap the fruit of deliverance from the curse and crush Satan's head. God gave you the covenant because you are weak, and He fulfilled it by His death. May you be blessed with this witness of God.

2. Discover yourself who is in Christ

- 1) Philippians 3:9 "And be found in him." Philippians 3:8 " Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ." To be found in Christ, that is, to discover one who is in Christ.
- 2) Galatians 6:17 "From now on let no one cause me trouble, for I bear on my body the marks of Jesus." He states that no man shall trouble him: for he bears in his body the marks of Jesus. This was not directed at the disciples. Many people were attacking Paul at the time.

- 3) Especially those who professed to be believers, but who had not left the law and the ideology of the Old Testament, troubled Paul a great deal. He said to them, "From now on you will no longer talk about me." Perhaps it means something like this.
- 4) 1 Corinthians 4:1 "This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God." Let men rightly regard you as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God. He was able to discover himself in Christ. No matter what anyone says to you, you are Christ's servants, and you are stewards of the mysteries of God for the ages, which is Christ.
- 5) God had entrusted him with such an important task, and he had this conviction even during a very difficult and sometimes frustrating situation. You shouldn't be swayed by what people say. No matter what the world says, Jesus is the Christ.
- 6) Those who attacked Paul most bitterly were the Jews who were in the faith; they knew him well from birth. But Paul did not waver. He gave them an answer, saying, from now on let no one cause him trouble, for he bears in his body the marks of Christ Jesus; and he is the one who has been entrusted with the mystery of Jesus Christ for this age. No one can trouble him anymore. It was a bold and confident message he relayed to them.
- 7) 1 Corinthians 11:1 "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ." He greatly discovered himself in Christ. It doesn't mean that in an arrogant way, but rather as someone so sure that if you imitate Paul who is of Christ, then one will come to the conclusion and have full conviction of Jesus Christ.
- 8) Paul was a man who knew who he was enough to say these things, the kind of things that come from a man who has made sure of who he is to God and who he is to Christ.
- 9) Paul was an evangelist who conquered Rome and broke the traditional law of Rome with the new culture of Christianity. May you be like him. You are the one entrusted with the mystery of Christ for this age. You are the servant of Christ who bears the marks of Jesus in you. Therefore, if anyone imitates you who imitates Christ will naturally know Christ and become a person of Christ. May you discover yourself in Christ.
- 10) When you have a personal relationship with Christ, when your heart is in tune with God's desires, and when the things of God's kingdom are your reason for living, you can say the same thing as the Apostle Paul. May you be blessed to have this kind of life for generations to come, and may it fill the church and the field.
