

Christ

Proverbs 8:22-36

Mankind are caught in a fate that they can never resolve on their own. From the start of Original sin, mankind fell into curses, disasters, and Satan's deception. The fall of mankind has completely blinded their eyes to see these things. There is a vague spirituality that remains, but in the end, they cannot reach the answer and there is no change in their lives. For mankind, God has given the answer to enjoy liberation, and that is Jesus Christ. When they discover Christ, prayer is answered and will receive evidence. God's desire is only to deliver Christ to save mankind, when this is found, greater and more precise answers are enjoyed. The Bible is the book that explains and proves this. May you be victorious and leave behind a masterpiece with this blessing. It doesn't take effort, it just takes for the spiritual eyes to open. You will live a grand life when you are connected with God. This principle is still true today.

1. Christ

- 1) Today's scripture states the amazing fact that Solomon knew Christ. It's the Proverb written by Solomon, a man who lived about 1000 years before Christ, and it describes Christ with such precision and specificity. It's not a proverb based on Solomon's humanistic perspective, but it's a confession of faith.
- 2) There are many references to Christ between Proverbs 8:22-31, but when you get down to the nitty-gritty, it's this. Solomon describes Christ, saying that "The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work" (Verse 22), "At the first, before the beginning of the earth" (Verse 23), "I was brought forth" (Verse 24-25), and "When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep" (Verse 27), so "then I was beside him, like a master workman, and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always" (Verse 30).
- 3) Solomon makes a very significant confession. His knowledge and confession of Christ were of a very high class. It is a proverb of proverbs. For what proverb is there in the world that is greater than Christ? Solomon appears to have been a man of great confidence in this knowledge and confession. Apostle Paul stated that he is the steward of God's mystery as men ought to regard him like that. And he states for them to be imitators of him for he imitates Christ.
- 4) Solomon states it in Proverbs 8:32 "And now, O sons, listen to me: blessed are those who keep my ways." Proverbs 8:34 "Blessed is the one who listens to me, watching daily at my gates, waiting beside my doors." Proverbs 8:35 "For whoever finds me finds life and obtains favor from the Lord."
- 5) The Lord asked his disciples who do you say that I am to you because everything in your life depends on it, and here is the answer. The centurion was a Gentile and a Roman citizen, but his confession of faith completely surprised Jesus. Luke 7:7 "Therefore I did not presume to come to you. But say the word, and let my servant be healed." It's a confession that he believed that Jesus is God and that he transcends time and space. Many people saw miracles through Jesus, but none of them made this confession.
- 6) Solomon didn't just write a book of Proverbs, either. He wrote a book of spiritual truths that are so accurate that you still see them today. It was a proverb, but it was a message from God, and it was the conclusion of the entire Bible. And yet, he confesses Jesus is the Christ straight to the point. It was a proverb among proverbs. May you be blessed to once again take Jesus Christ as your covenant and be like Solomon, Paul, and Abraham, who saw the time of Jesus.

2. The year of prayer

- 1) This is God's word to you this year. God does everything by the Word. Every biblical figure who lived through their time received a Word for their entire life. May this Word be the Word for you this year.
- 2) Through prayer, you must enjoy the temple, economy, and guidepost of light. Through this, you must enjoy the answer of true revival, 300% journey, and the 3 courtyards. It is a beautiful thing when one prays to God, and it will be living and active to which answers will come and make your life filled with authority.
- 3) Christ's death on the cross and shedding of His blood for you was meant to conquer the world and live by that authority. Therefore, it is not God's will that you, who have been made alive by the blood of that promise, should be weighed down or oppressed by anything in the world.
- 4) Therefore, God answers. Without the answer, one cannot come out of the oppression. He fulfills the covenant for those who hold it and pray for it. There is no such thing as a good prayer or a bad prayer. Even when you pray a prayer that is not in line with God's will, God will correct it and give you the right answer. Hannah is a prime example of this.
- 5) Even Moses didn't put his life on the line for God's mission from the beginning. Jonah ran away, and Abraham and Sarah laughed when God gave them a promise. Jacob was not aligned with God so God struck him in the hip, and even the 10 scouts and the Israelites lamented against God all night long.
- 6) But God's promise was fulfilled and they got to see God's masterpiece. On Friday, we're praying for healing, the church, 237 nations, the next generation, and the multiethnic movement. It is truly pleasing to God to be blessed together and to pray and to pray for those around you.
- 7) May this be the year that you receive answers first as you pray with the covenant. May it be the year that you please God by praying for those around you. God gave the word "year of prayer" to mean that if you pray, He will answer. May you be blessed in this way, individually, in your homes, and the field.
